
WELCOME

Langkawi comprises a group of 99 tropical islands lying off the northwestern coast of Peninsular Malaysia, about 30 km from Kuala Perlis and 51 km from Kuala Kedah on the mainland. The main island is known as Pulau Langkawi. The islands are shrouded with an intriguing heritage of myths and legends that feature ogres and gigantic birds, warriors and fairy princesses, battles and romance.

As a natural paradise, the islands are perhaps unmatched anywhere else in Southeast Asia. Fine beaches offer sun-filled days of complete relaxation. The clear emerald waters around the islands are perfect for a host of water sports and recreational activities.

Langkawi has been accorded the UNESCO Global Geopark status for its beautiful geological heritage of stunning landscapes, karsts, caves, sea-arches, stacks, glacial dropstones and fossils. With a geological history dating back 550 million odd years, the islands contain unique rock formations that stir the imagination and baffle the mind.

Langkawi is perfect for doing everything or nothing at all. Enjoy nature-based activities, or simply laze by the beach. There is also a host of unique attractions for those who enjoy sightseeing. The gentle smiles and warm hospitality of the locals will soon charm you. Come to Langkawi for a holiday unlike any other.

YOUR FIRST STOP

Visitors by air and sea will arrive in Langkawi via Kuah, the island's main town and administrative centre. Kuah Jetty, the main take-off point to the mainland, is also located here.

Kuah is a busy but quaint town with a character of its own. It is lined with hotels, shopping centres, administrative offices, business complexes and restaurants, yet retains the unique laidback island atmosphere.

The name Kuah comes from the Malay word 'gravy'. The name goes back to an ancient folklore where two battling giants overturned a gigantic pot of curry at the spot where the town now stands

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

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C Eagle Square

One of Kuah's most significant attractions is the Eagle Square which features the iconic statue of a russet eagle from which the name Langkawi is derived. The landscaped square features scenic ponds, bridges, covered terraces, restaurants and barrel vaults made of bricks.





BEACH LIFE

PANTAI KOK, PANTAI CHENANG, PANTAI PASIR TENGKORAK, DATAI BAY, BURAU BAY, PANTAI TENGAH AND PANTAI TANJUNG RHU are just

some of Langkawi's idyllic beaches, perfect for carefree sun-filled days and quiet evening strolls. Most beaches have their own character and charm. Pantai Chenang, the most popular beach, exudes fun and energetic vibes with lots of water sports, trendy beach cafes and an exciting nightlife. Pantai Tengah, the longest stretch of beach on the island, is perfect for families with cosy resorts and more water sports. Datai Bay and Burau Bay are great options for visitors who opt for tranquility in the enclave of exclusive, upscale resorts and secluded coves.



TANJUNG RHU lies on the northern cape of Langkawi. Aptly named for its abundance of casuarinas, this enchanting beach affords magnificent views of nearby islands, which can be reached at low tide on foot.



PULAU PAYAR MARINE PARK

is situated in the northern part of the Straits of Malacca, 19 nautical miles south of Langkawi and encompasses the islands of Pulau Payar, Pulau Lembu, Pulau Segantang and Pulau Kaca. The marine park teems with a fascinating diversity of marine life and vegetation. Pulau Payar is the most popular of the islands as its sheltered waters are ideal for snorkelling, diving and swimming. Among the enchanting dive sites is the Coral Garden, an area covered with bright, multi-hued soft corals.

Visitors can get to Pulau Payar from Kuah Jetty by catamaran or speedboat. The catamaran takes about one hour to get to Pulau Payar while the speedboat takes about 30 minutes. It is advisable to book the catamaran service a day before the trip. An entry fee to the marine park is chargeable.

ISLAND CRUISES are a great way to relax and take in the breathtaking scenery of Langkawi. As your boat weaves through the watery passageways between the islands, enjoy the cool breeze and warm rays of the sun. A round trip around Dayang Bunting and Beras Basah Island takes about four hours. Alternatively charter a boat and enjoy a fantastic sunset cruise with cocktails. Special itineraries with barbecue meals, snorkelling trips or excursions to other islands can also be arranged.

SOUTHEAST ASIA'S FIRST

GEOPARK Langkawi, which has the distinction of being the first geopark in Malaysia and in the region, has many geosites with outstanding sights for visitors. There are three geoforest parks in Langkawi - the Machinchang Cambrian Geoforest Park is reputed to be the oldest geological formation in the country. At the Kilim Karst Geoforest Park, one can view magnificently-formed landscapes from nearly vertical to subrounded karstic hills as well as pinnacles of various shapes and sizes. The Dayang Bunting Marble Geoforest Park boasts fine marbles.

LAKE OF THE PREGNANT MAIDEN or Tasik Dayang Bunting, with its uniquely-coined name, is sure to enthrall you with its beautiful surroundings and mysterious past. The name of Langkawi's largest freshwater lake is attributed to the legend of a lovely fairy princess who married an earthly prince. Her first child died shortly after birth. She was so sad and depressed that she buried the child in the crystal clear waters of the lake.


Before she returned to her celestial abode, she blessed the waters so that any childless maiden who bathed in the lake would conceive thereafter. To reach the lake one has to get to the Island of the Pregnant Maiden first and then take a short walk through the forest reserve.




SUNGAI KILIM offers some truly unforgettable sights and experiences for adventurous travellers to Langkawi. A tour that is bound to provide plenty of thrills is the boat cruise to Kilim Karst Geoforest Park. Spread over an area of 100 square kilometres, Kilim Nature Park features a beautiful mix of well-protected green mangrove forests, isolated white beaches and blue lagoons.

On the trail, along the calm winding river, you will be exposed to the wonders of the park's marine ecosystem and flora and fauna like the overhanging Bogak Trees, Brown Eagles, Tree Crabs, iguanas and macaques. Enjoy the scenic and spectacular view of unique limestone rock formations emerging from the floor of the mangrove swamps and the sea.


These fascinating geological wonders have been dubbed the Temple of Borobodur, the Elephant Stone and the Hanging Gardens.



TEMURUN WATERFALL located within the Machinchang Geoforest Park near Datai Bay, the Temurun Waterfall is Langkawi's tallest waterfall. This seasonal waterfall is best visited between May to October as the water would be reduced to a mere trickle during the dry season. Clearly visible from the road, this waterfall is a refreshing respite from the hot and humid weather.



SEVEN WELLS or Telaga Tujuh, located in the northwestern corner of Langkawi, is a geological marvel. The waterfall is so named because the cascading waters are broken by a series of seven natural pools. The lush green forest that surrounds the waterfall adds a mystical touch to the natural splendour. Legend has it that fairies used to come down to the waterfall to bathe and frolic. Waterfall Abseiling is available here.



DURIAN PERANGIN WATERFALLS is suitable for a swim, picnics and recreation. This 14-tier waterfall is truly a sight to behold and is accessible after a short trek through the rainforest.





CAVES in Langkawi worth exploring include Gua Cherita which is easily accessible and situated only 30 minutes by boat from Tanjung Rhu. Inside are interesting rock formations steeped in fabled tales of mystery and romance. Look out for ancient inscriptions on the walls.

Another interesting cave is Gua Kelawar nestled in the heart of a mangrove forest. A wooden platform allows visitors easy access through the cave. Gua Pasir Dagang, about 45 minutes by boat from Kuah, has a shallow stream running right through the cave. The boat journey to the cave itself is an adventure of sorts. Guides can be engaged for cave expeditions.





LANGKAWI SKYCAB

Enjoy an exhilarating cable car ride to the top of Gunung Mat Chincang. Visitors can enjoy marvellous views of the Andaman Sea and the Langkawi island group, as well as breathtaking sights such as overhanging cliff walls and isolated pinnacles. With a length of 950 m, the Langkawi SkyCab has been recognised as 'The Longest Free Span Single Rope Cable Car' by the Malaysia Book of Records. It also has one of the steepest gradients in the world, at 42°.

At the middle and top stations, walking trails and viewing platforms are available for visitors to further enjoy the panoramic views. Langkawi SkyCab is situated at the Oriental Village in Burau Bay, about 30 minutes away from Kuah town. After the ride, drop by at the Oriental Village to browse through the assortment of souvenirs.



LANGKAWI SKY BRIDGE

How would you like to walk along one of the world's scariest bridges? Measuring 125 m in length, Langkawi SkyBridge is touted as the World's Longest Free Span and Curved Bridge. Completed in 2004, this suspended bridge sits at the peak of Gunung Machinchang. Hanging about 100 m above ground, it swings out over the landscape and offers the chance to enjoy the beauty of the virgin jungle from otherwise unattainable locations. In contrast to a straight bridge where the end is always in sight, a curved bridge offers changing perspectives as one walks along.



DARULAMAN SANCTUARY is located at the foothills of Gunung Raya, Langkawi's highest point. The sanctuary is set within an area dotted with wild flowers, gigantic trees, streams and an assemblage of over 100 medicinal plants. MARDI AGRO TECHNOLOGY PARK

Love orchards and fruit trees? Mardi Agro Technology Park is the place to take in lovely views of tropical plants, fruits and herbs. Stretching over 27.39 hectares, this park showcases how modern technology is used in the agricultural industry.

Here, visitors can go on a tour around the verdant land and gain an insight into more than 20 seasonal and non-seasonal fruit trees. A special reward awaits at the end of the tour, where you can savour an assortment of juicy and delicious local fruits. Another attraction here is the palm leaf origami created for each visitor.

EAGLE SQUARE or Dataran Lang is Langkawi's most prominent landmark for visitors arriving by sea. Situated near the Kuah Jetty, the main attraction of the square is the magnificent statue of the reddish brown eagle majestically poised for flight. According to local folklore, Langkawi derived its name from the eagle or helang. In old Malay, 'kawi' denotes reddish brown, hence Langkawi means 'reddish brown eagle'.

The square is beautifully landscaped and features scenic ponds, bridges, covered terraces, restaurants and barrel vaults made of bricks. The square is beautifully illuminated at night and presents a dramatic setting as you approach the island from the sea.



TAMAN LEGENDA OR LEGENDS PARK

is a scenic park with beautiful gardens of vivid local blooms, plants and fruit trees. This 50-acre park has been designed and landscaped with exhibits detailing the myths and legends of the island. It houses 17 monuments, each with an intriguing story to tell.

KOTA MAHSURI with its fabled and historical past is a significant site on the island that has been preserved for posterity. Kota Mahsuri is located about 12 km from Kuah at Kampung Mawat. This memorial is erected in honour of Mahsuri, a fair maiden who had been unjustly accused of adultery. According to legend, she had bled white blood at her execution as a sign of her innocence. In her dying breath, she laid a curse on the island, declaring that it would remain barren for seven generations. Fact or fiction, seven generations have since passed and today, Langkawi is a flourishing tourist destination. There is also a museum here where tourists can view a recorded interpretation of the Mahsuri legend.

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UNDERWATER WORLD LANGKAWI features the island's rich treasure trove of marine life. Located at the popular Chenang Beach, this aquarium features more than 5,000 types of aquatic life, exhibited in more than 100 tanks of different sizes. The highlight is a giant tank housing large marine species such as sharks, stingrays, moray eels and green turtles, with a 15 m tunnel for visitors to walk through. Watch these magnificent underwater creatures at feeding time.

At the New Wing, visitors have the chance to view the latest additions to the Underwater World - penguins and seals! The penguins include Sub-Antarctic Rockhoppers and include Black-footed species from Africa. The former is fed at 11.30am and 3.30pm, while the latter at 9.30am and 2.30pm. The harbour seals are fed at 11am and 3pm daily. Drop by these hours for a delightful experience! This new facility also has a three-dimensional (3D) theatre that airs informative documentaries on the island's marine life.

There is also a restaurant offering popular traditional Malay recipes and local delicacies, which are prepared using rice as the main ingredient.



THE MAHSURI INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION CENTRE (MIEC) is a popular


venue for international events. It is also one of the largest exhibition and convention centres in Malaysia. It is strategically located in Padang Matsirat near the Langkawi International Airport.

LANGKAWI TRAVEL

Here are some tips to make the best of your visit to this ecological haven while practicing responsible tourism and minimising negative environmental impact.

ENVIRONMENT

- Langkawi is a UNESCO Global Geopark. Please be careful and avoid chipping off rock formations.
- Avoid taking any shells or fossils from the island.
- If you are driving, always be mindful of wildlife crossing, especially small animals such as monkeys.
- It is best to avoid feeding monkeys along the roadside, as this increases the risk of road kills.
- Observe wildlife from a safe distance to ensure that their natural behaviour and instincts are maintained.
- Avoid the use of plastics and do not litter to preserve the fragile ecosystem.





TRANSPORT

 Visitors can hire e-hailing rides, taxi services or a private car to get around the island. For those of you who like a bit of adventure, motorbikes are a great option to explore at your own pace.

GENERAL

- As in other islands, always be ready with a waterproof bag to protect your belongings during boat rides.
- There's plenty of local food to try out at the beachside cafes. Hotels and cafes serve Malaysian and international fare.
- ATM facilities are available at the airport and several shopping areas, but visitors are advised to prepare adequate cash just in case.
- Pantai Chenang is a hive of activity with restaurants, bars and other tourist attractions.
 For those who want a more quiet getaway, Pantai Tengah and Tanjung Rhu are great options.

GETTING TO LANGKAWI



BY ROAD

Visitors travelling by road have to drive to Kuala Kedah or Kuala Perlis on the north-western coast of Peninsular Malaysia, the main take-off points by ferry to Langkawi. The journey from Kuala Lumpur to Kuala Kedah takes about six hours while Kuala Perlis is an additional hour away. Car parking facilities are available at both jetties.





BY AIR

Langkawi International Airport at Padang Matsirat is about 20km from Kuah and 8km from Pantai Chenang, Langkawi is easily accessible from Malaysia's main gateway, Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA), via the national carrier Malaysia Airlines and Malindo Air. Langkawi is also accessible from the Sultan Abdul Aziz Shah Airport in Subang via Malindo Air and Firefly. The budget carrier AirAsia flies to Langkawi from KLIA2. Langkawi can also be accessed from other parts of the country such as the neighbouring state of Penang (via AirAsia and Firefly). Visitors from Singapore can fly in to Langkawi via AirAsia and Scoot Air. AirAsia and China Southern connects Langkawi to Guangzhou in China.
